# American Psychological Association (APA) 6th edition (2010)

- APA style is an author-date citation style
- There are the two major components
  - 1. The in-text author-date citation at the appropriate place within the text of the document, e.g.

In patients with diabetes and hypertension, a screening and intervention program administered (Roush, 2009)

# 2. The reference list at the end of document.

# In text citing : General note

- Insert an in-text citation when your work has been influenced by someone else' work
- The in-text citation consists of :
  - 1. Author surname (s) followed by the year of publication
  - 2. Included page or chapter or paragraph number for direct quotes

The theory was put forward by Smith (2005, p. 45)

- The in-text citation is placed immediately after the text which refers to the source being cited

# **Reference list** : General notes

- One space your reference list and have a hanging indent (the first line of each reference is fully while subsequent lines are indented to the right. The width of hanging should be 5-7 spaces or 1.25 cm.) e.g.

\*\*All of the references in the reference list must also be cited in the text
